Who are the Speakers?

Drugs—Maja Roe & Ian Stevens DCC MAT Team—Maja and Ian will be delivering a presentation on drugs and their use within the area, They will provide information on what drugs are currently being used by young people in the area, what parents should look out for and how parents can access support.

Child Sexual Exploitation—Lucy Smith— At 13-years-old Lucy was groomed and sexually exploited by a gang of men. To escape the situation she and her family fled the UK when she was 15. Two years later, they returned to England and Lucy started to rebuild her life. By the age of 21, Lucy had a book published on her experiences and worked on various projects to combat child sexual exploitation. Now, aged 25, she is working with organisations across the UK to raise awareness of the issue. She has appeared on Sky, BBC and ITV News, Panorama, Britain’s Sex Gangs on Channel 4 and was a consultant for the Whitney storyline on Eastenders.

Sexting—Norman Cooper & Polly Thornton , Safe and Sound—Safe and Sound works to keep children and young people safe and sound from sexual exploitation & wider issues eg: Sexting. They provide support directly to children, young people and families in Derby and Derbyshire affected by the abuse and work to ensure that individuals receive the support they need to move forwards in their lives.

Mental Wellbeing—Dawn Wain, Child and adolescent mental health services (CAMHS)
- Recent reports have highlighted an increase in mental health issues particularly amongst young people. One in 10 children and young people have a diagnosable mental health condition while similar numbers with less serious mental health problems will need help at some point during their development. Dawn will provide information and advice on support available for parents and their children.
